SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIM INFORMATION FORM

If you have been the victim of a sexual assault, your cooperation will be requested by police. **You may be asked:**

1. Detailed questions about the crime by the officer and medical personnel;
2. To allow a health care provider to collect physical evidence from you;
(NOTE: It is important NOT to shower before a medical exam can be conducted.)
3. To testify in court after the assailant is arrested.

If you are going to the hospital for a sexual assault medical examination, the officer must contact a Rape Counseling Service advocate to provide support for you during the examination process unless you request that RCS not be notified.

Sexual assault by a person known to you, including your spouse, is a crime and will be investigated.

The reporting officer will write a police report that may be assigned to a detective for follow-up investigation.

You have a right to have a Victim Advocate and a support person present at any follow-up interviews by law enforcement authorities, attorneys, or defense attorneys.

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If you wish to file a criminal complaint and the suspect has NOT been arrested, contact the **Fresno Police Department** at 621-2460. The Police Department's hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00am-4:00pm. **Please wait 7 days before telephoning** to insure they have received a report of your case.

You have a right to have a domestic violence counselor and a support person of your choosing present at any follow-up interviews by law enforcement, prosecutors or defense attorneys. You also have specific rights under Marsy's Law at www.ag.ca.gov/victimservices.

You have the right to request the officer issue an **Emergency Protective Order** for you and your family's protection until you can seek court action described below.

You have a right to appear in Superior Court and file a petition requesting any of the following orders for relief.

1. An order restraining the attacker from abusing you and other family members.
2. An order directing the attacker to leave the household.
3. An order preventing the attacker from entering your residence, school, business, or place of employment.
4. An order directing that either or both parties participate in counseling.
5. An order awarding you or the other parent custody or visitation with a minor child or children.
6. An order restraining the attacker from molesting or interfering with a minor child or children in your custody.
7. An order directing the party not granted custody to pay support of the minor child or children if that party has a legal obligation.
8. An order directing the defendant to make specific debt payments coming due while the order is in effect.

You also have the right to file a civil suit for losses suffered as a result of the abuse, including: medical expenses, loss of earnings, and other expenses for injuries sustained, damage to property, plus any other related expenses incurred by you or any agency that shelters you.
