




Founded in 1948

The city of Orange Cove is a comfortable agricultural community located along the eastern foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Located within a 4-hour drive of the San Francisco Bay and Los Angeles basin areas, the city lies 35 miles southeast of Fresno and a 30-minute drive east of Freeway 99 in central California.

The city enjoys a year-round growing season for the hundreds of acres of orange and lemon citrus fruit surrounding the community, served by major local packing house operations. Orange Cove is a destination site for the annual spring Fresno County Blossom Trail event that kicks off the agricultural growing season. It is located within a 1-hour drive of the Kings Canyon and Sequoia National Parks for fishing, hiking, and family recreational activity.

Community Incentives

HUBZone

The chief advantage a HUBZone Certification gives a small business is preferential treatment when bidding on Federal Contracts

- The HUBZone firm gains a 10% cost advantage in bidding on government contracts over non-HUBZone competition
- Certified HUBZone firms can also qualify for higher SBA-guaranteed surety bonds on construction and service contract bids

Recycling Market Development Zone

The RMDZ loan program can also fund a maximum of 75% of costs directly attributed to an eligible project up to a maximum of \$2 million, whichever is less

- One-stop permitting assistance
- Waiver or reduction of development/permit fees
- Revolving loan fund, and installment payment of fees






Population by Race (2012)
