1. Can the City provide tonnage history or volume projections of abandoned items collected?

2020 = 6373 Tons

2021 = 6669 Tons

2022 = 2752 Tons

- 2. Does the City envision a bundled price for three containers (trash, recycle, organics) for commercial and MF? Yes

- 4. Extending bulky collection to MF residents (2 x year up to 4 items) include each MF property or each MF unit? If the latter, can the City provide an estimated number of units?

 Multi Family Unit. 802 Units.
- 5. What tonnages can the City provide for 2022? See above.
- 6. Will the City provide a draft of the franchise agreement prior to the due date? No
- 7. Can the City provide a 2023 rate sheet?

Residential = \$21.03

Commercial = \$96 Gallons @ \$42.06

2 Industrial accounts = \$130.60 (weekly), \$908.26 (5x per week).

8. Does the City currently have a SB1383 ordinance in place?

9. The RFP mentions a mandatory bidders meeting but there is no date or time on the schedule. When and where would this be taking place?

No mandatory bidders meeting will be needed.

10. Thirty five and 65 gallon carts are not common in Urban areas as the cost per gallon has minimal financial impact and they increase the possibility of contamination in other carts. Was this

requirement intended to satisfy only the needs of Senior citizens and handicapped residents or does City expect those sizes to be available to all residents?

Intended for Senior citizens and handicapped residents.

11. For the Holidays mentioned, is a one day delay acceptable?

Yes

12. The RFP mentions periodic "sweeps" for abandoned items by the awardee but also mentions monthly collection of abandoned items collected by the city crews and consolidated at the City Yard. Is the expectation that the city crews will collect the abandoned items and the hauler would then pick them up from the city yard once a month?

Yes, once a month or when called by the department.

- 13. Can the City clarify whether Residential Recycling and Green Waste containers are currently serviced weekly or every other week? Weekly.
- 14. On Pages 2-3 of the Notice, under Commercial Collection, a quantity of twenty-three (23) 3-cubic yard bins are noted for Recycling Service and no carts. Based on this, should we assume that only a portion of the of approximately 138 commercial accounts have a recycling program in place?

Revised quantities (page 2 and top of page 3): Commercial Accounts Trash/Recycling 29 – 96 gallon carts 73 – 3 cubic yard bins

- 15. Would the City be able to provide the past three years of total tonnages collected for Trash,
 Recycling, Green Waste/Organics and Construction/Demolition for Residential, Commercial, and
 Industrial accounts?
 See above.
- 16. On Page 3 of the Notice, special events services are required to be provided at up to nine (9) City events. Would the City be able to provide a list of some or all these events, their duration (in days) and the estimated types (Trash, Recycling and/or Organics) and levels of service (container counts and sizes) expected at each?

At this time the City does not have enough detailed information on the 9 events that will occur every year but here is a list:

- Easter
- Cinco De Mayo
- 4th of July Celebration
- Farmers Market (3x)
- Halloween
- Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony
- Veterans Day

17. On Page 3 of the Notice, Trash, Recycling and Organics services are required to be provided at eight (8) City facilities and eight (8) parks. Would the City be able to provide the service levels, including container counts, sizes and frequencies for these facilities and parks?

All facilities will required a 3-cy bin except Public Works who will need a 20-cy. Below is a list of facilities:

18. On Page 3 of the Notice, the collection of abandoned items from the City Yard is required to be provided. Would the City be able to provide a list of the types and quantities (in tons) of materials collected as well as the method and frequency of collection?

For Example: Broken furniture and miscellaneous household trash is placed in 25-cubic yard roll off containers serviced twice monthly.

The abandoned items will vary but includes furniture, mattresses, sofas, debris. Toonage will vary month to month.

- 19. Would the City be able to provide the current monthly rates for the following services? See above Question 14 and details below:
 - Standard 3-container 96-gallon Residential service \$21.03
 - Additional Residential Trash Cart Not Applicable
 - Additional Residential Green Waste Cart Not Applicable
 - Additional Residential Recycling Cart Not Applicable
 - Rates for 1-, 1.5-, 2- and 3-cubic yard Commercial trash service for all frequencies (one, two, three, or more times per weeks) Only 3-cubic yard bins.

- 21. As Page 3 of the Notice requires the provision of Roll-off and Temporary Bin services, would the City be able to provide some or all the following details regarding the current service?
 - A. The annual number of Roll-Off hauls and/or number of customers subscribing to permanent Roll-Off service and their service levels.
 - B. The current rates for roll-off services, including:
 - The rate per haul and any monthly rates for permanent services
 - The disposal/processing rates (per ton) for Trash, Recyclables, Green Waste, and Construction/Demolition debris.

- 22. Pages 14-15 of the Notice requires the provision of Bulky Item Collection to Multi-Family complexes. Would the City be able to provide the total number of multi-family units?

- 24. With regard to Multi-Family complexes, will the City's be requiring each to take a minimum level of Recycling and/or Organics service? If so, will that be a specific minimum amount per account or per dwelling unit? All complexes are required to comply with SB1383.
- 25. Page 1 of the Notice states that "service would include hauler-provided annual route reviews and seasonal (twice per-year) waste evaluations as directed by the city." As Section 18984.5. of SB 1383 regulations allow jurisdiction to meet their container contamination minimization requirements by conducting either route reviews or waste evaluations, would the City accept proposals that include just one of these approaches to meeting the container contamination minimization requirements? Yes.
- 26. How many residential accounts are actually serviced? Page 1 of the RFP indicates 1509 and 2603. Please clarify.

1509 Residential accounts.

- 27. Are all residential accounts billed by the City? Yes.
- 28. Please provide a Commercial Collection matrix that would indicate the frequency of collection for each size container by commodity type (MSW, Recycling, Organics).
 Please see question 19. Additional frequency information will be provided soon.
- 29. We have no information on the service levels of the roll-off services. Please provide how many roll-off boxes, sizes, and number of services by container size. Please see above.
- 30. Is the Commercial and Roll-Off invoiced by the Contractor?

- 31. Referencing the above question, if the Commercial and Roll-Off services are invoiced by the Contractor, should the pricing proposed include the franchise fees?

- 32. On Page 2 at the top of the page, the RFP indicates 1Community Clean annually, but on page 15 it indicates 2 Community Cleanups. Need clarification on which is correct.2 Community Cleanup days per year will be required.
- 33. Can we provide truck specifications after the award? They will comply with the RFP specifications on equipment. Trucks will need to be purchased to service Orange Cove. Truck specifications will need to be provided prior to the contract award.
- 34. Can the chosen Contractor start the Agreement with some diesel trucks and phase in the CNG trucks as they arrive (supply chain issues).
 No.
- 35. Please provide annual tonnage by commodity type (MSW, Recycling, Organics). See question 1.
- 36. There is a discrepancy on the number of City Facilities and City Parks on Page 3 versus Page 11. Please clarify which is correct.
 - There are 8 Facilities and 6 Parks. All of which require 3 cubic yard bins. Public Works will require a 20 cubic yard bin.
